## Approval of minutes: Laura and Mei

Donna Blackburn: Trustee been that since 2010, distilled rumors that school would be closing.

**Role of the trustee:** 1 employee, director of education, we hire and monitor their progress, pass the strategic plan, and a balanced budget. With COVID Board of Trustees has been able to ID things. Donna voted to bring back police involvement in the schools. She meets with all her school councils. Requests

and welcomes emails and phone calls. Ottawa Carleton Assembly of Schools (OCASC) sits in on these meetings also.

**Question: Yanling Wang:** Requests the number of students in Barrhaven who attend Merivale, how many require the bus, and what arrangements will be made for bussing next year?

Jean answers: Will have more accurate numbers in summer; She works with OCTranspo daily and they have added a second 80 bus which has improved transit. Over 800 students issued presto passes. OSTA controls these decisions and Jean mentions surveys that were emailed from OCT and encourages parents to complete them. No routes were canceled, they have had route corrections. OSTA has been very professional.

**Tim:** shares that Donna will likely not be our Trustee after this year.

Question: Laura Storrie: How can we improve our sense of community and engage with families – she feels it starts with our relationship with the trustee. Asks for a review of the trustee's responsibilities.

Laura asks Donna how to make things better and be able to have our voices heard? How does the trustee set priorities? Curious about the reason trustee's social media presence has dropped with fewer posts? How does the trustee report back to us? How is information reported to us and how do parents find out what is happening on the board?

**Donna explains:** How to access what is going to be discussed, and the agenda. It is online and listed prior, everyone can watch the meeting. Donna clarifies that she was invited to this meeting but attended the meeting earlier this year on her own accord. Donna has an "open-door policy" and will speak to anyone who wants to.

**ASHA Ali: Question:** Asks about the motion for reinstating police activity in school. Is there any new development that prompted this activity?

**Donna responds:** Currently, all the principals can do is call 911. director of education – **Gemma Nicholson,** agenda for the board, you can submit a delegation and give a personal opinion and address trustees. Submit 4 days prior to the meeting.

## OCDSB Community Hours Form


















# Extracurricu lar
