	Black Excellence Guest Speaker: Classes who attended: Grade 11 Theory of Knowledge, Grade 9 Visual Art, Grade 10 Canadian History, Kosisochukwu Nnebe is a Nigerian-Canadian visual artist. Inspired by postcolonial theorists Frantz Fanon and Edouard Glissant, Nnebe's practice is invested in unraveling the process of racialization and re-thinking the politics of Black visibility. Moving across installation and lens-based media, Nnebe creates works that shapeshift and transform to reveal a glimpse into new ways of seeing and understanding Blackness.

LANGUAG ES	The Languages team put off a week to celebrate la Francophonie. Students created and facilitated activities during lunch that were linked to various French cultures around the world.


	This was an excellent opportunity to bring the school community together and have students using their French outside of a classroom setting.

April Informal Marks: Teachers will share a mark update via Credit Counselling Summary (CCS) for all students. This will be a printed page with next year's course selections visible. Students will receive their copy at school (last class of the day) on **25 April**. The OUAC/OCAS upload will occur on 27 April. Please

note that students with missing assignments/tasks will see the impact of "not handed in" in the form of a placeholder "0". We encourage students to take advantage of ASAP on Mondays and to work with their teachers if this applies to their circumstances.

EQAO Math: Is planned for 7-8-9-12 June (Wed – Mon). This is a fully online task and will occur in our grade 9 Math classrooms supervised by students' regular teachers. Mr. Gibson and Ms. Elmer will coordinate.
