#### Principal's Report – Jean Fulton-Hale

**Continuing Education:** We are excited to be launching a free after school tutoring program for grade 7-12 students within our school board.

#### **Enrolment Update:**

- Intermediate: actual 314 students = increased to 12 Homerooms from 11 Homerooms, staffing ongoing until about 12 October
- Secondary: actual 1354, slight increase in classes, all student timetables are built; staffing will be ongoing until about 17 October

**Crosswalks:** Students in all grades are asked to cross Viewmount at CONTROLLED crosswalks only. Crosswalks are available at Merivale and Viewmount and Grant Carmen and Viewmount. Crossing at the Metro is extremely dangerous and we ask families to meet their student in a spot that promotes safety. There is no stopping on Viewmount in either direction. Our neighbours at the Metro kindly ask that you choose a better spot to meet your student as their parking lot is very small.

**Athletics:** Secondary Athletics for fall sports has started; seasons are abridged due to impacts on transportation (Varsity B-ball, Sr Boys VBall, Field Hockey, XCR, Ultimate). Thank you to our volunteer teacher coaches.

**Concussion Info:** student athletes and their parents/guardians must complete the Concussion Code of Conduct documentation prior to their student athlete being eligible to play. Coaches have communicated this information via Google Classroom and/or Athletic forms.

#### Secondary:

- Extra-Curricular Clubs are starting, the Library Commons hosts all Virtual Club links in the Google Classroom.
- A&E: Secondary progress reports will be shared in November. This is a very preliminary snapshot of student learning, and students should expect their achievement levels to change as the course progresses. Students will see a much more fulsome body of evidence of learning report card in February, which is the end of term 1, and the start of the second half of the school year.

## School Council Meetings for 2022-2023 Year

  - Winter months have always been slower for participants, due to bad weather and additional travel times

    - Virtual Meetings for February, March

#### Question and Answer

Why was touch football cancelled for intermediate students?

- This was not a school-based decision to not run intermediate touch football
- Interschool play must also be considered (not just what MHS may or may not be able to do)
- OCDSB has a central committee responsible for which programs will come online
- Cross Country is an example of a program that was brought back online, however it takes time to get programs back up and running considering the impacts the last couple of years
- OCDSB and Schools are working together to get as much started as possible at this time
- A reminder that Intermediate programs occur during the school day (not after hours) and teacher volunteers are required to advise/run these programs, and there is an overall shortage of teachers across the board at this time
- External/Parent volunteers is something that could be looked at, but will have substantial
  challenges due to student safety, training requirements, liability, etc., so it cannot be
  entertained directly at this time

Where can I find a list of clubs?

- Available on the Library Google Classroom that all students have access to
- Each club also has their own Google Classroom in most cases

Were can I find a list of sports?

- Announcements are made and are available on the Announcements button on the main MHS website
- Posted by the new Gym

How can we make sure that all students have an opportunity to sign up for clubs?

- School is working on a common structure for clubs for both intermediate and secondary to ensure maximum opportunities for students
- Intermediate interest has grown
- Teachers are also sharing interests to start clubs

Do clubs only start at the beginning of the year?

- No
- Reminder that each club requires a teacher advisor/sponsor to operate

Buses are getting kids late to school on a regular basis, which is going on their records

- If more than 15 minutes late, need to sign off in office, otherwise teacher will mark late
- OC Transpo is short on drivers now, but have been more stable than OSTA
- Students are not penalized for being late if there are good reasons
  - o Each late is given a specific reason as they why they were late
  - If enough lates draw attention, the administration looks at the reason, and if it was due to bus, there's no action required

Buses aren't making students tap their card to demonstrate use, and drivers should enforce that

 School has special windows where they enforce that action, just for counting purposes, otherwise it is not really necessary

Some drivers are picking up at different locations and are not doing the express route

• Admin requested specific examples and to email them to address

When will Grade 10's get lockers?

- There are two zones in the school where that can't be done yet
- Grade 10 is getting next week
- If no locker, coaches can arrange a storage area for stuff, as we enter the winter months

Students don't appear to be biking safely and are riding through intersections at an angle, and through cars waiting at the lights. There have been several situation where a car almost hit a student or a cyclist almost ran into a student.

- A message on bike safety will be shared again, in order to bring awareness
- Organizations like Parachute come and speak to students about lived experience
- OSTA may have something for bikes

Can OC Transpo move the bus stop, as the current one appears to encourage jay walking through traffic?

- Admin will ask OC Transpo the question during one of their regular meetings
- What are the IB Program details?
  - Two schools are aligned with an IB coordinator each
  - This is the first graduating year from MHS
  - 140 students per year, so 560 in the program overall each year at MHS
  - This is a wide/robust program

Are Portables for Secondary Students only?

- Yes, all 17 classrooms for intermediates are in the building
- It is a large campus this year

What languages are offered?

• English, French, and Spanish (Spanish starts in Grade 10)

Shouldn't there be an IB representative as part of the School Council?

- The council needs to focus as a whole School Council
- This has been discussed in the past, but did not align with the whole school direction
- Any question can be asked by any parent of any student at School Council
- There are specific info sessions hosted by the Admin to address any program questions
- There are multiple programs and streams at MHS, so inclusivity is critical
- If there are specific concerns, they can be raised directly with the Admin or the IB coordinator, or at a regular council meeting for broader concerns

What's the Lunch program look like this year?

- Intermediate Awareness upstairs for 7's and 8's for secondary students
- Secondary Manage themselves and can leave campus

How is MHS keeping people out of the building for safety

- MHS is a closed campus during the day, therefore no outsiders are allowed on site
- If anyone is noticed, alert a teacher or the admin immediately
- Admin and teachers are very comfortable with recognizing who belongs and who does not, and take action immediately
- Admin is always watching, especially during the changes between classes

Did MHS lose the school resource officer?

- Yes, the OCDSB trustees made that decision, which can be found on their website in full Who can validate credit counts?
  - Guidance Counselor's are the right people

Can students eat lunch in different locations that the cafeteria?

• Yes – there are picnic tables outside, some enjoy the grass/trees, etc, as long as it is not in a construction area or a Lab/Specialized classroom or the Library. Hallways can be used as well
