

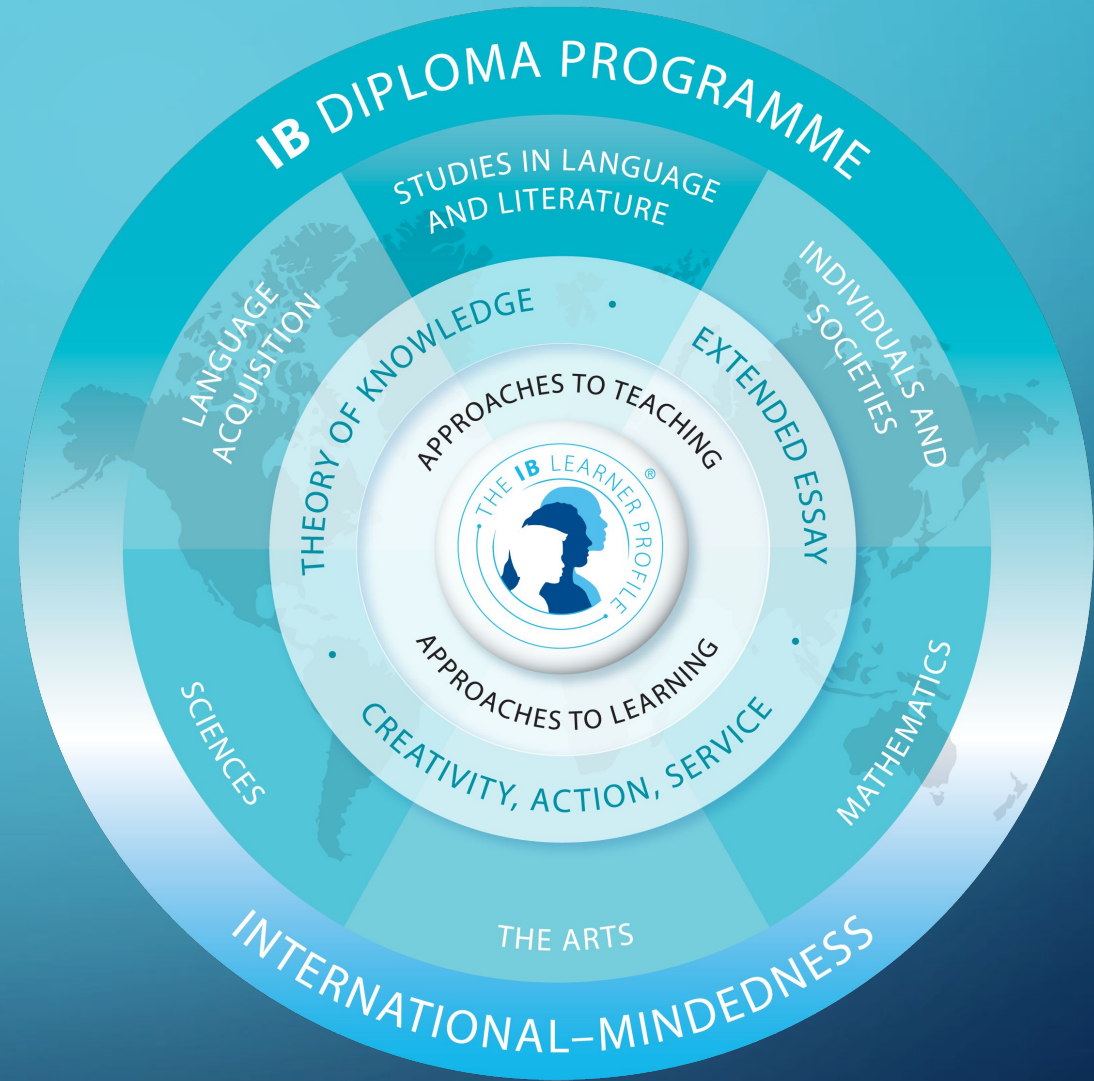

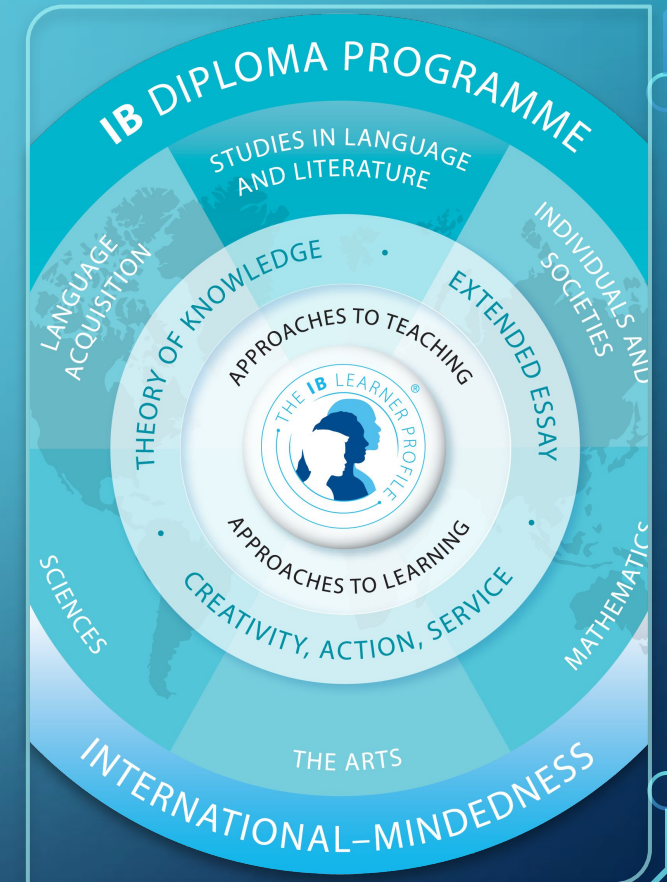
PROGRAM OVERVIEW

- Skills development



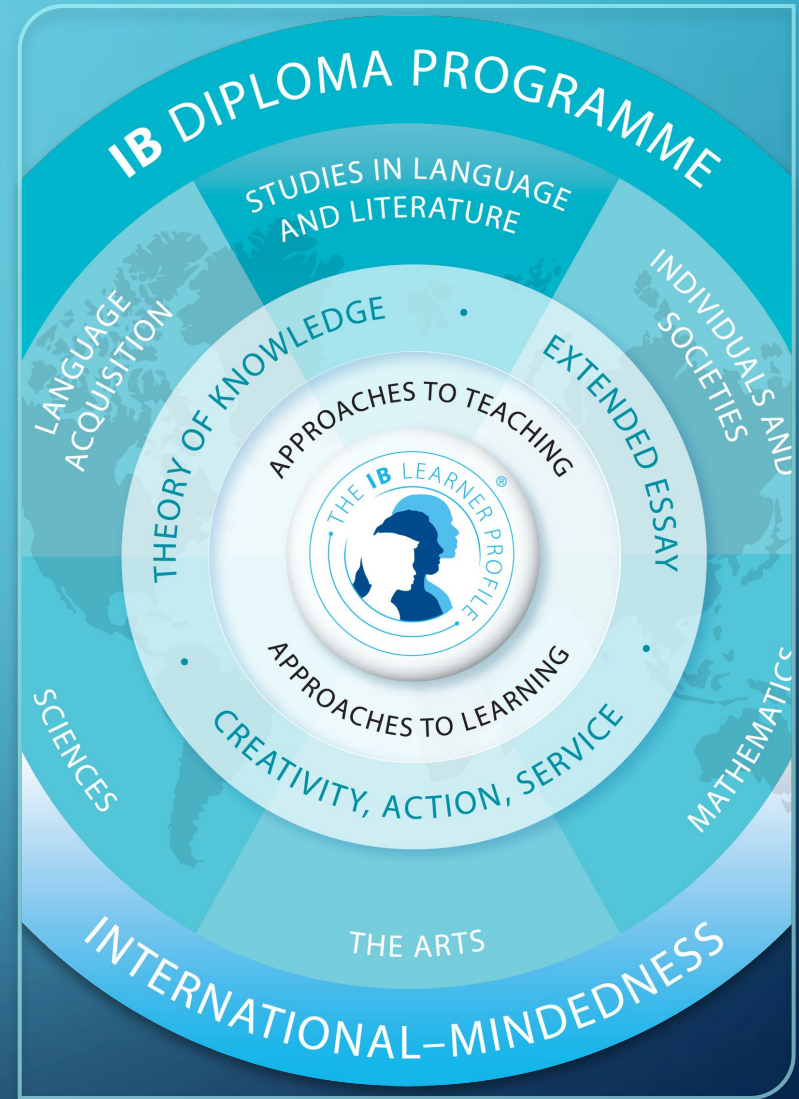
GRADE 10

GRADE 10

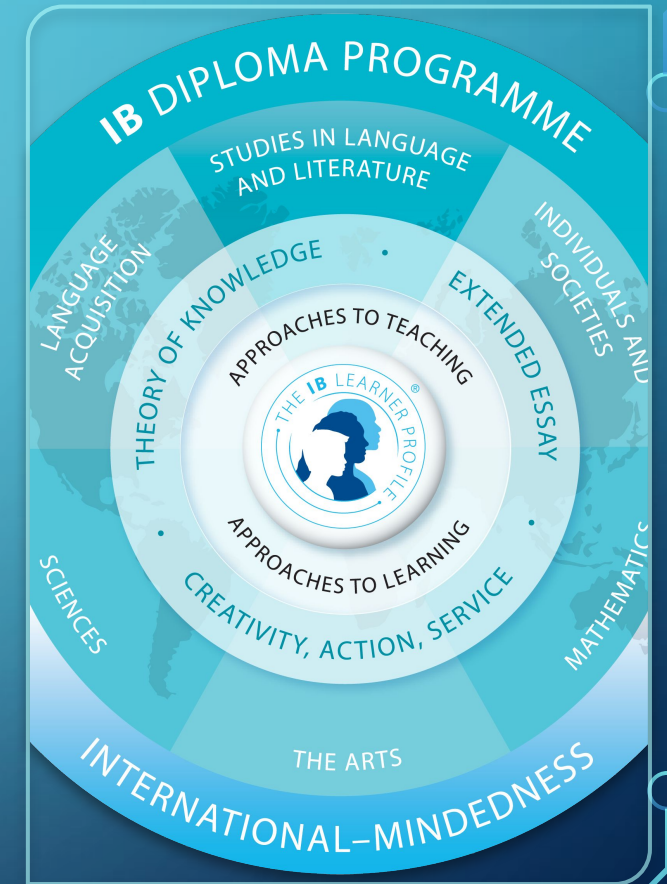
IB cohort classes in your child's timetable will be marked with an "E" (English) or a "J" (French Immersion). These classes are meant to prepare them for the challenge of the IB Diploma classes in Grades 11 and 12.



GRADE 10

Pre-DP classes differ in three significant ways:

- Depth – Students go deeper into subject topics than they might in an Ontario course.
- Acceleration – Subject material will come at a faster pace in IB classes.
- Skills – focus on a different skill set to prepare for success in 11-12.



SUCCESS IN IB

- Not defined by grades
- Not defined by class ranking
- Success is defined by skill development
- Development will happen at different rates for everyone
- The objective is learning measured by the individual, not by a group.
- Time management.

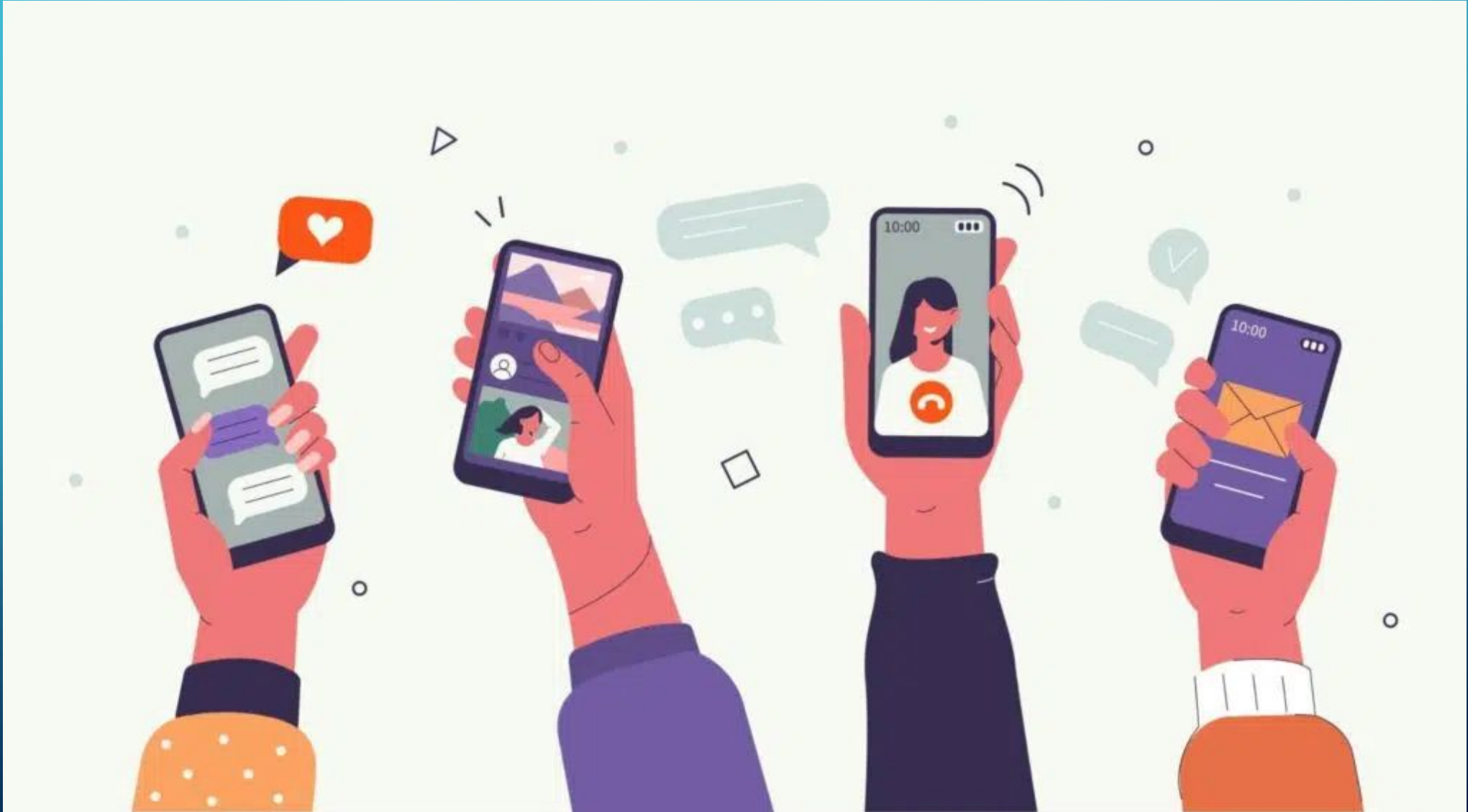
